

1886 Utah Fishing Law

FISH AND GAME

AN ACT Supplemental to Chapter VI. Session Laws of 1884 entitled, "An Act for the Protection of Fish and Game."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah: That any person who willfully kills or destroys any trout less than six inches long is guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 2. Any person who has in his possession any trout taken unlawfully is guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 3. Any person who willfully takes kills or destroys any elk, mountain sheep or antelope during the four years next ensuing, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 4. That section 10 of Chapter VI. of Session Laws of 1884 is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XXXIV.

OF BEFOULING OF WATERS.

AN ACT to Prevent the Befouling of Waters used for Domestic Purposes.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah: That it shall be unlawful for any person, corporation or company within the Territory of Utah, 1st. To sheep-pen, stable, pig-pen, chicken-coop or other offensive yard or outhouse, where the waste or drainage, therefrom shall flow directly into the waters of any stream, well or spring of water used for domestic purposes; 2d. To deposit, pile, unload, or leave any manure heap, offensive rubbish, or, the carcass of any dead animal where the waste or drainage therefrom will flow directly into the waters of any stream, well or spring of water used for domestic purpose: 3d. To yard, camp or corral any loose cattle. horses, mules, sheep or swine where the waste or drainage therefrom will flow directly into any stream, well or spring of water used for domestic purposes.

SEC. 2. Any person committing any of the before named offenses shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
