Utah Fishing Law 1911

CHAPTER 119.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

An Act to amend Section 511 of the Compiled Laws of Utah, 1907, as amended by Chapter 89 of the Session Laws of Utah of 1909, relating to County Commissioners, and arranging the subdivisions of said section into Independent sections to be known as Sections 511 to Sections 511x52, both Inclusive.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Utah:

SECTION 1. Section Amended. That Section 511 of the Compiled Laws of Utah, 1907, as amended by Chapter 89 of the Session Laws of Utah of 1909, be and the same is hereby amended so that the same shall read as follows:

511. Powers of Board. The Board or County Commissioners in each county has jurisdiction and power, as in the following sections enumerated, under such limitations and restrictions as are prescribed by law:

511x14. Fish and Game. To make regulations for the protection of fish and game; provided, that such regulations shall not be in conflict with the laws of the State for the protection thereof.

CHAPTER 151.

GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS.

An Act making appropriations for the Support of the State Government for two years, beginning January 1st, 1911, and ending December. 31st, 1912, and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Utah:

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, for the support of the government of the State of Utah, as hereinafter expressed from January 1st, 1911, to December 31st, 1912.

To the Governor:

For clerk to the state fish and game commissioner 1,800.00 For necessary traveling expenses, hatchery superintendents, chief wardens, repairs and maintenance, for the purchase of eggs, freight, etc., or so much thereof as may be necessary, payable out of the State fish and game fund, but that no mileage shall be charged or allowed where free transportation is used 62,500.00

Provided that said building shall be constructed under the supervision of the Board of Directors of the Utah State Fair Association, and according to plans and specifications to be approved by the State Fish and Game Commissioner.
