

1935 Utah Fishing Proclamation

March 12, 1935

A PROCLAMATION

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

WHEREAS, it has become advisable to extend the seining season for carp only in Utah lake for the year 1935,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that I, Newell B. Cook, Utah State Fish and Game Commissioner by virtue of authority vested in me under section 30-0-7 Compiled Laws of Utah, do hereby proclaim and declare the extended season for carp only from April 1 to April 20, both dates inclusive.

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS , it has become advisable to permit fishing in certain of the streams of this State prior to June 15, 1935.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Newell B. Cook, Fish and Game Commissioner of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of this state, do hereby proclaim and declare that all streams of this State, except as herein below otherwise provided shall be and are hereby opened to fishing commencing at 4 a. m. Sunday, May 19, 1935.

The following lakes and streams of this state shall be closed to fishing until 4 a. m. the morning of June 15, 1935, to-wit:

All lakes in the Uintah Mountains lying above an altitude of 7,000 feet and that portion of all the streams in the Uintah Mountains lying above an elevation of 7,000 fee (this includes the lakes at the head of the Provo, Duchesne, Rock Creek, Uintah, Green and Bear River, but does not include Moon Lake in Duchesne County: which will be open to fishing on the morning of May 19, 1935)

Spring Lake and Lehi Ponds in Utah County;

All of the Weber River above the mouth of the Smith-Morehouse in summit county:

East Canyon from White's Crossing to East Canyon Dam, Morgan County;

The Smith-Morehouse above the Smith-Morehouse dam, Summit County;

All of the Provo River and its tributaries above Sunnybrook in Wasatch and Summit Counties;

All of the tributaries to Beaver Creek above Kamas, Summit County;

Freemont River, Sevier County, its entire length;

Seven Mile Creek, Sevier County, its entire length;

Johnston's Reservoir, Sevier County;

Forsyth Reservoir, Sevier County;

U. M. Cree, Sevier County, its entire length;

Huntington river and its tributaries above the point where it junctions with Bulger Creek;

PROVIDED that the portion of Red Creek in Wasatch and Duchesne Counties lying above the point where the Victory Highway crosses said creek and all of Currant Creek in Wasatch and Duchesne Counties shall be closed to fishing until 4 a. m. the morning of July 1, 1935.

PROVIDED that the following waters shall be closed the entire year 1935:

All waters above the mouth of the narrows of South Fork of the Ogden River, Weber County;

Temple Fork, a tributary to the Logan River, in Cache County, the entire length;

City Creek, Salt Lake County, the entire length;

Little Cottonwood, Salt Lake County, through the Murray City park only;

That portion of Fishlake lying within a radius of 250 feet from the mouth of Twin Creek, Sevier County;

Echo Dam for a distance of one hundred and fifty feet above the dam and two hundred yards below the dam, Summit County;

Heiner Creek, Summit County, its entire length:

Midway Spring Creek its entire length, Wasatch County;

South Fork of the Provo River, commencing at the mouth of the fork at Vivian Park its entire length, Utah and Wasatch Counties;

Deer Creek, Wasatch County, a tributary to the Provo River;

That portion of the Provo River and its tributaries from the Carterville bridge north of Provo to Smith's Channel west of Provo, Utah County;

Beaver Dams on South Fork of Weber River on the Thomas Ranch, Summit County;

Spring Creek and Fort Creek between Peoa and Weber River, Summit County;

Blue Spring Creek Garfield County, its entire length;

Ipson Creek, Garfield County, its entire length;

Mill Fork of Diamond Creek up to the lone Pine near Springville Crossing in Utah County;

The waters of Brush Creek between the Vernal-Manila Highway and the Diamond Mountain-Uintah County Road in Uintah County.

Provided that, "It shall be unlawful to angle for fish in the Strawberry Reservoir in Wasatch county or in any of its tributaries, except that in the Strawberry Reservoir, the Strawberry River up to the Victory Highway Bridge in Indian Creek above the diversion works and in Fish Creek and its tributaries above Pleasant Valley Reservoir in Carbon County, it shall be lawful to angle for fish between July 1 and October 20 following. In Fish Lake in Sevier County, Navajo Lake in Iron County and Blind Lake in Wayne County it shall be lawful to angle for fish only between June 15 and October 1, following."

#### A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, it has become advisable to permit fishing in the Strawberry Reservoir prior to the regular opening date and to restrict fishing in certain other waters as follows.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Newell B. Cook, Fish and Game Commissioner of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of this state, do hereby proclaim and declare that said Strawberry Reservoir, Wasatch County, Utah shall be and is hereby opened to fishing on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1935, commencing at 4 a. m., except that portion of the Strawberry Reservoir

within two hundred yard radius from the mouth of the spillway, which shall remain closed to fishing until 4 a. m. the morning of July 1, 1935.

AND THAT, Sheep Creek in Cache County, Utah, its entire length, is hereby declared closed to fishing the entire year 1935.

This does not include any of the tributaries to the said Strawberry Reservoir. All such tributaries shall remain and are hereby declared closed to fishing the entire year of 1935.

### A PROCLAMATION

September 24, 1935

WHEREAS, it has become advisable to close the following waters in the State of Utah to fishing:

Kent Lake in Beaver County, Otter Lake in Beaver County, the Logan River in Cache County from the government dug-way to its source, Enterprise Reservoir in Washington County; Oak Creek in Milliard County, its entire length; All of Provo River below north fork at Wildwood in Utah County,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Newell B. Cook, Fish and Game Commissioner of the State of Utah, by virtue of authority vested in me under section 30-0-7, Revised laws of the State of Utah, 1933, do hereby declare and proclaim the above water closed to fishing for the year 1935, commencing October 15, 1935.
