March 21, 1940

A PROCLAMATION

FISHING *** BEAR LAKE

WHEREAS, Bear Lake in Rich County, Utah, extends also into the State of Idaho, and

WHEREAS, Idaho opens fishing season on Bear Lake on May 1, 1940, and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with an agreement between the State of Utah and the State of Idaho it is deemed advisable to open Utah's portion of said Bear Lake at an early date,

NOW THEREFORE, I, Newell B. Cook, Utah Fish and Game Commissioner, under authority of Section 30-C-7, Revised Laws of Utah, 1935, do hereby proclaim and declare said Bear Lake to be open to fishing at 4:00 o'clock a.m. May 18, 1940, such open season to continue until 9:00 o'clock p.m. December 15, 1940,

EXCEPT, said Bear Lake shall remain closed for a radius of 1/4 mile from the mouth of Swan Creek until July 1, 1940.

STATE OF UTAH
FISHING PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to make changes in fishing seasons on certain waters otherwise opened to fishing under Section 30-0-33, Revised Laws of Utah, 1933, wherein dates for fishing for game-fish are prescribed by the State Legislature,

NOW ~~THEREFORE~~, I, Newell B. Cook, Fish and Game Commissioner of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 30-0-7, Revised Laws of Utah, 1933, do hereby proclaim and declare that all waters of the State shall be opened to fishing from June 15 to October 31, 1940, inclusive; except as hereinafter prescribed:

PROVIDED: the following waters are hereby declared closed to fishing for the entire year of 1940, to-wit:

STATE FISH HATCHERIES:

That all waters within all properties owned or controlled by the State Fish and Game Department for Fish Hatchery purposes shall be closed to fishing the entire year of 1940.

BEAVER COUNTY:

The adobe Yard Slough, between the Beaver State Fish Hatchery and a point approximately 300 ft. west of the west property line of Kelly's Hatchery.

ELDER COUNTY:

Black Slough, west of Brigham City.

CACHE COUNTY:

Temple Fork; White Pine Creek; Beaver Creek and Logan River above their junction; the tail race at the Logan City Power Plant in Logan Canyon; Rock Creek and Curtis Creek from the Bear Lake Road to their source; Sheep Creek from Anderson's Ranch to its source; and headwaters of East Canyon and South Fork Canyon, as marked and posted on the ground.

GARFIELD COUNTY:

North Creek, Beaver Reservoir, and East Fork of Pine Creek near Escalante; Ipsen Creek and Blue Spring Creek near Panguitch Lake.

JUAN COUNTY:

Birch Swamps Stream; Bradley Canyon; Hop Creek and Pole Canyon streams.

KANE COUNTY:

Duck Creek Spring and Duck Creek Lake.

MORGAN COUNTY:

Stoddard Slough from the Stoddard-Milton Road to its source. Francis Creek from its junction with Lost Creek to its source.

SALT LAKE COUNTY:

Mountain Dell Reservoir in Farley's Canyon; Porter's Fork in Mill Creek Canyon; City Creek; Mill Creek and its tributaries between 7th East and 9th East Streets; and Little Cottonwood through Murray City Park.

SAN JUAN COUNTY:

Dark Canyon Lake in La Sal Mountains.

SANPETE COUNTY:

Snow Lake, east of Ephraim, near Skyline Drive.

SEVIER COUNTY:

Fremont River below the Johnson Valley Reservoir for a distance of 300 yards.

Fishlake for a radius of 250 yards from the mouth of Twin Creeks.

Seven-Mile Creek from the bridge to its source.

SUMMIT COUNTY:

Heiner Creek; Echo Reservoir for a distance of 250 yards above spillway intake and from the needle valve of the dam downstream an approximate distance of 500 yds. to a point where said stream joins the old river bed.

KANABCH COUNTY:

Provo River downstream from deer Creek Reservoir Spillway to the junction of Provo River and Deer Creek.

WHEELER COUNTY:

All waters above the mouth of the narrows of the South Fork of the Ogden River; Causeur Creek and all its tributaries; and Wheeler Creek.

BE IT FURTHER PROVIDED: that the season during which it shall be lawful to fish in certain waters, as provided for under Section 30-0-33, Revised Laws of Utah, 1933, shall be amended as follows:

BEAVER COUNTY:

Kents Lake, from June 15 to July 15, inclusive.

CARBON COUNTY:

All tributaries emptying into Scofield Reservoir, except Gooseberry C.C.C. pond, July 1 to October 15, inclusive.

Duchesne COUNTY:

Red Creek and Current Creek above the Victory Highway bridges over said streams, from July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

All lakes except Moon Lake and all streams above the 7000 ft. level or as marked and posted on the ground, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

EMERY COUNTY:

Boulger and Huntington Creeks above their junction, July 1 to October 31 inclusive.

SANFORD COUNTY:

Tropic Reservoir, from June 15 to July 31, inclusive.

IRON COUNTY:

Navajo Lake, June 15 - September 30, inclusive.

NICH COUNTY:

Bear Lake, except for a radius of 1/4 mile from the mouth of Swan Creek, May 19 to December 15 inclusive; above mentioned radius from mouth of Swan Creek, July 1 to December 15. (Former Proclamation dated April 26, 1940)

SANPETE COUNTY:

All tributaries emptying into Scofield Reservoir except Gooseberry C.C.C. pond, July 1 to October 15, inclusive. Gooseberry C.C.C. Pond, June 15 to October 31, inclusive. Ferron Reservoir; Huntington Creek and Boulger Creeks above their junction July 1 to October 31 inclusive.

SEVIER COUNTY:

Fishlake; Johnson Reservoir; and Seven Mile Creek below the bridge, June 15 to September 30, inclusive.

U. M. Creek, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

SUMMIT COUNTY:

All lakes and streams above the South boundary of Holliday Park - July 1 to October 31, inclusive. Scout Lake, at Camp Steiner, July 27 to August 31, inclusive.

UTAH COUNTY:

Fork
South of Provo River, June 15 to September 30 inclusive.

WASATCH COUNTY:

Strawberry Reservoir, except 100 yards radius from spillway, June 15 to October 15, inclusive. Radius of 100 yards from Strawberry Spillway, July 15 to October 15, inclusive. Provo River and its tributaries and all lakes above Soapstone Bridge, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

Red Creek and Current Creek above the Victory Highway bridge; over said streams, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

Blind Lake, June 15 to September 30, inclusive.

BE IT FURTHER PROVIDED: that Locomotive Springs in Boxelder County and Clear Lake in Millard County, shall be closed to the fishing and taking of bass during the entire year of 1940. (This does not prohibit fishing for other species of fish in these waters.)

REDUCTION OF BAG LIMITS:

Be it further provided that the bag or creel limit on all species of trout shall be not more than eight (8) pounds or not more than twenty (20) fish in any one day, but if after catching in weight less than eight pounds a fish of more than the required weight to make eight pounds should be caught, such fish may be kept; and that it shall be unlawful to have in possession at any one time more than sixteen (16) pounds or two days creel limit of any or all varieties or species of trout.

STATE OF UTAH
FISHING PROCLAMATION

May 27, 1940

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to make changes in fishing seasons on certain waters otherwise opened to fishing under Section 30-0-35, Revised Laws of Utah, 1933, wherein dates for fishing for game fish are prescribed by the State Legislature,

NOW THEREFORE, I, Norrell B. Cook, Fish and Game Commissioner of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 30-0-7, Revised Laws of Utah, 1933, do hereby proclaim and declare that all waters of the State shall be opened to fishing from June 15 to October 31, 1940, inclusive, except as hereinafter prescribed.

PROVIDED, the following waters are hereby declared closed to fishing for the entire year of 1940, to-wit:

STATE FISH HATCHERIES:

That all waters within all properties owned or controlled by the State Fish and Game Department for Fish Hatchery purposes shall be closed to fishing the entire year of 1940.

BEAVER COUNTY:

The Adobe Yard Slough, between the Beaver State Fish Hatchery and a point approximately 300 ft. west of the west property line of Kelly's Hatchery.

OXFORD COUNTY:

Black Slough, west of Brigham City.

CACHE COUNTY:

Temple Fork; White Pine Creek; Beaver Creek and Logan River above their junction; the tail race at the Logan City Power Plant in Logan Canyon; Rock Creek and Curtis Creek from the Bear Lake Road to their source; Sheep Creek from Anderson's Ranch to its source; and headwaters of East Canyon and South Fork Canyon, as marked and posted on the ground.

GARFIELD COUNTY:

North Creek, Barker Reservoir and West Fork of Pine Creek near Escalante; Ipsen Creek and Blue Spring Creek near Panguitch Lake.

GLAUC COUNTY: Birch Swamps Stream; Braulay Canyon; Hop Creek and Palis Canyon streams.

KANE COUNTY:

Duck Creek Spring and Duck Creek Lake.

MORGAN COUNTY:

Stoddard Slough from the Stoddard-Hilton Road to its source. Francis Creek from its junction with Lost Creek to its source.

SALT LAKE COUNTY:

Mountain Dell Reservoir in Parley's Canyon; Porter's Fork in Mill Creek Canyon; City Creek; Mill Creek and its tributaries between 7th East and 9th East Streets; and Little Cottonwood through Murray City Park.

SAN JUAN COUNTY:

Dark Canyon Lake in La Sal Mountains.

SANPETE COUNTY:

Snow Lake, east of Ephraim, near Skyline Drive.

SEVIER COUNTY:

Fremont River below the Johnson Valley Reservoir for a distance of 300 yards.

Fishlake for a radius of 250 yards from the mouth of Twin Creeks.
Seven-Mile Creek from the bridge to its source.

SUMMIT COUNTY:

Heiner Creek; Echo Reservoir for a distance of 250 yards above the spillway intake and from the needle valve of the dam downstream an approximate distance of 500 yards to a point where said stream joins the old river bed.

WASATCH COUNTY:

Provo River downstream from Deer Creek Reservoir Spillway to the junction of Provo River and Deer Creek.

WEBER COUNTY:

All waters above the mouth of the narrows of the South Fork of the Ogden River; Causour Creek and all its tributaries; and Wheeler Creek.

BE IT FURTHER PROVIDED that the session during which it shall be lawful to fish in certain waters, as provided for under Section 30-0-25, Revised Laws of Utah, 1933, shall be amended as follows:

BEAVER COUNTY:

Kents Lake, from June 15 to July 15, inclusive.

CANYON COUNTY:

All tributaries emptying into Scofield Reservoir, except Gooseberry CCC pond, July 1, to October 15, inclusive.

DUCHESNE COUNTY:

Red Creek and Current Creek above the Victory Highway bridges over said streams, from July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

All lakes except Moon Lake and all streams above the 7000 ft. level or as marked and posted on the ground, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

ELSI COUNTY:

Boulger and Huntington Creeks above their junction. July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

EARLEND COUNTY:

Tropic Reservoir from June 15 to July 31, inclusive.

INDY COUNTY:

Navajo Lake, June 15 to September 30, inclusive.

RICH COUNTY:

Bear Lake, except for a radius of 1/4 mile from the mouth of Swan Creek, May 15 to December 15, inclusive; above mentioned radius from mouth of Swan Creek, July 1 to December 15. (Former Proclamation dated April 26, 1940)

SANPETER COUNTY:

All tributaries emptying into Scofield Reservoir except Gooseberry CCC pond, July 1 to October 15, inclusive. Gooseberry CCC Pond, June 15 to October 31, inclusive. Ferron Reservoir; Huntington Creek and Boulger Creeks above their junctions July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

SEVIER COUNTY:

Fishlake; Johnson Reservoir; and Seven Mile Creek below the bridge, June 15 to September 30, inclusive.

U. M. Creek, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

SUMMIT COUNTY:

All Lakes and streams above the South boundary of Holliday Park - July 1 to October 31, inclusive. Scout Lake at Camp Steinar, July 27 to August 31, inclusive.

UTAH COUNTY:

South Fork of Provo River, June 15 to September 30, inclusive.

Fishing

KASACH COUNTY:

Strawberry Reservoir, except 100 yards radius from spillway, June 15 to October 15, inclusive. Radius of 100 yards from Strawberry Spillway, July 15 to October 15, inclusive. Provo River and its tributaries and all lakes above Soapstone Bridge, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

Red Creek and Current Creek above the Victory Highway bridges over said streams, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

LAYNE COUNTY:

Blind Lake, June 15 to September 30, inclusive.

BE IT FURTHER PROVIDED that Locomotive Springs in Boxelder County and Clear Lake in Millard County shall be closed to the fishing and taking of bass during the entire year of 1940. (This does not prohibit fishing for other species of fish in these waters.)

REDUCTION OF BAG LIMITS:

Be it further provided that the bag or creel limit on all species of trout shall be not more than eight (8) pounds or not more than twenty (20) fish in any one day, but if after catching in weight less than eight pounds a fish of more than the required weight to make eight pounds should be caught, such fish may be kept; and that it shall be unlawful to have in possession at any one time more than sixteen (16) pounds or two days creek limit of any or all varieties or species of trout.
