

SPECIAL FISHING PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to make changes in the fishing regulations for certain species of fish otherwise restricted under Sections 30-0-32 and 30-0-35, Utah Code Annotated 1943, wherein unlimited fishing and methods of fishing for certain varieties of fish are prescribed by the State Legislature;

NOW THEREFORE, we, the Fish and Game Commission of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in us under Section 30-0-7, Utah Code Annotated 1943, do hereby proclaim and declare that it shall be lawful for any person holding a valid fishing license to take carp, suckers and other common fish in the Weber River below the Power House situated in the mouth of Weber Canyon, during the hours of 6:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. from April 1, 1945 to December 31, 1945, by methods prescribed under Section 30-0-34 and 30-0-35. The bag or creel limit shall be not more than 30 fish in any one day and it shall be unlawful to have in possession more than two (2) day's legal catch at any one time.

Be it further provided that violations of any of the regulations of this proclamation shall be termed a misdemeanor and this proclamation shall have full force and effect of the law.

MEMORANDUM TO M. J. MADSEN

Please draw up a proclamation opening the Weber River below the power house for the snagging of trash fish. This was approved in the recent Commission meeting.

MEMORANDUM FOR ROSS LEONARD:

In going over the request made by the Davis County boys on this Weber River snagging, I find that the law prescribes under Section 30-0-35 that snagging will be permitted in a number of places from April 1 to May 20 each year and the Weber River below its junction with the Ogden River is included in these waters. The way the proclamation would read, it would permit the use of spears and grappling hooks in the Weber River, for the entire year. It would be my suggestion to limit the use of spears and grappling hooks to these dates mentioned under Section 30-0-35, but throughout the entire area they suggest and also permit unlimited angling in the area suggested by them for the entire year.

SPECIAL PROCLAMATION
Issued February 10, 1945

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to make changes in the fishing regulations for certain species of fish otherwise restricted under Section 30-0-32, Utah Code Annotated 1943, wherein unlimited fishing for certain varieties of fish are prescribed by the State Legislature.

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Fish and Game Commission of the State of Utah by virtue of the authority vested in us by Section 50-0-7, Utah Code Annotated 1943, do hereby proclaim and declare that it shall be lawful for any person holding a license to angle for Catfish (except Channel Catfish), common fish and Yellow Perch during the hours from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. from February 1, 1945 to January 1, 1946.

The bag or creel limit on Common Bullhead Catfish and Yellow Perch taken from Utah Lake shall be not more than ten (10) pounds or not more than thirty (30) fish in any one day, but if after catching in weight less than ten (10) pounds, a fish of more than the required weight to make it ten (10) pounds should be caught, such fish may be kept. This shall constitute one day's legal catch and it shall be unlawful to have in possession more than two day's legal catch at any one time.

Be it further provided that violation of any of the regulations of this proclamation shall be termed a misdemeanor and this proclamation shall have full force and effect of the law.
