

UTAH STATE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

1960 ANGLING REGULATIONS

After due investigation, we the Fish and Game Commission of the State of Utah, by authority of Title Number 23, Session Laws of 1953, do hereby proclaim the following orders governing the taking of fish from the waters of Utah. These orders will rescind all previous orders and shall be effective January 1, 1960 through December 31, 1960, unless otherwise altered by our own executive action. All dates herein mentioned shall be inclusive.

A. GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. GENERAL SEASON: The taking of fish by angling shall be permitted from the first Saturday in June (June 4) through November 30, 1960 during the hours from 4:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Mountain Standard Time in all waters of the State of Utah except where otherwise specified under Section B, C, and D of this proclamation.

2. LICENSES: It shall be unlawful for any person, except children under twelve (12) years of age, to take, pursue, angle for, or possess fish of any species while on any lake or stream of this State without first procuring a suitable license to do so.

3. BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS: The daily bag and possession limits may include but not exceed the following:

- TROUT, SALMON** in the aggregate—Ten (10) fish or seven (7) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.
- GRAYLING** in the aggregate—Ten (10) fish or seven (7) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.
- BONNEVILLE CISCO:** Twenty-five (25) fish.
- BLACK BASS, WHITE BASS, AND PIKE** in the aggregate—Ten (10) fish or fifteen (15) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.

e. WHITEFISH OR CATFISH: Twenty (20) fish or twenty (20) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.

f. All other fish species not mentioned above, no bag, size or possession limit.

g. THE DAILY BAG and possession limit for resident children under twelve (12) years of age shall be four (4) game fish or three (3) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first. Fish taken by a non-resident under twelve (12) years of age are included in the limits of the licensed angler who must accompany the non-resident juvenile.

h. WEIGHTS shall be computed on dressed fish with heads and tails intact.

4. SIZE LIMITS: No size limit on game fish or non-game fish species.

5. METHODS OF ANGLING:

a. It shall be unlawful to take or attempt to take fish by any means other than angling. Angling shall mean fishing with a single line attached to a rod or pole, or trolling board held in the hands or attended and having attached thereto bait or lure as permitted in this section.

BOX ELDER COUNTY: Locomotive Springs, Honeyville Ponds and Mantua Reservoir.

CACHE COUNTY: Impoundments on Logan River, impoundments on Blacksmith Fork River, Spring Creek Reservoir, Wellsville Reservoir, Glittens Springs and Chambers Springs.

DUCHESNE COUNTY: Hodes Creek Reservoir.

IRON COUNTY: Lowder Ranger Station Lake.

JUAB COUNTY: Cherry Creek Pond.

KANE COUNTY: Duck Creek Springs Lake, Mirror-Aspen Lake.

RICH COUNTY: Little Creek Reservoir.

SALT LAKE COUNTY: Silver Lake.

UTAH COUNTY: Payson Lakes, Provo River upstream from Carlelassen Bridge, Spring Lakes, Silver Lake and Pittsburg Lake.

WASATCH COUNTY: Writts Lake.

WASHINGTON COUNTY: Pine Valley Reservoir and Grass Valley Reservoir.

b. ANGLING FROM: Boats, rafts or other floating devices with motors is permitted on the following.

BEAVER COUNTY: Indian Creek Reservoir, Middle Kents Lake, Minersville Reservoir, Otta Lake, Puffers Lake and Three Creek Reservoir.

CACHE COUNTY: Bear River downstream from the Idaho State line, Little Bear River downstream from Highway 69, Cutler Reservoir, Hyrum Reservoir, Newton Reservoir, and Pelican Ponds.

CARBON COUNTY: Scofield Reservoir.

DAGGETT COUNTY: Green River and Spirit Lake.

DUCHESNE COUNTY: Borham Lake, Mirror Lake, Moon Lake, and Scout Lake.

EMERY COUNTY: Cleveland Reservoir and Miller Flats Reservoir.

GARFIELD COUNTY: Lower Bowns Reservoir, Colorado River, North Creek Reservoir, Pangultch Lake, Pine Lake, Posoy Lake, Tropic Reservoir, and Wide Hollow Reservoir.

GRAND COUNTY: Colorado River and Green River.

IRON COUNTY: New Castle Reservoir, Paraganah (Red Creek) Reservoir, and Yankee Meadow Reservoir.

JUAB COUNTY: Mono Reservoir and Yuba Reservoir.

MILLARD COUNTY: Diversion Dam north of Delta on Sevier River and Gunnison Bend Reservoir.

MORGAN COUNTY: East Canyon Reservoir.

PIUTE COUNTY: Otter Creek Reservoir and Piute Reservoir.

RICH COUNTY: Bear Lake.

SALT LAKE COUNTY: Jordan River.

SAN JUAN COUNTY: San Juan River and Colorado River.

SANPETE COUNTY: Fairview Lakes,

above the confluence with Shingle Mill Creek.

East Canyon Creek: Closed from East Canyon Reservoir Dam downstream for approximately one-quarter mile as posted.

RICH COUNTY: Woodruff Creek from Highway No. 3 upstream to point known as Red Rocks, Birch Creek drainage excluding Allen Canyon Creek (Walton's Canyon).

SALT LAKE COUNTY: City Creek drainage, Mill Creek from 9th East to 7th East. Mountain Dell Creek from Mountain Dell Reservoir to cattle guard on Emigration-Parleys Canyon cut-off road.

SEVIER COUNTY: Mouth of Twin Creeks as marked and posted.

SANPETE COUNTY: Palisado Lakes.

UTAH COUNTY: Spring Creek from State Fish Hatchery to steel plant, the tail race of the Olmstead Hydro-electric plant from its point of origin to the point of its confluence with the equalization canal approximately 250 yards from the point of origin, the equalization canal throughout its approximate 100-yard course from the Provo River to the Olmstead tail race, the Provo Bench (or Big Bench) Canal from the point it crosses the north boundary of the Hole Stream Generating Plant properties being the south boundary of Utah Highway No. 52, to a point 350 yards distance along the canal course.

UINTAH COUNTY: East Park Reservoir.

WASATCH COUNTY: Deer Creek from Highway No. 189 upstream to railroad crossing above Government property; Provo River immediately below Deer Creek Reservoir Dam and Deer Creek Reservoir in front of dam as marked and posted by Provo River Water Users markers; Midway Hatchery stream from hatchery property downstream to railroad bridge crossing, Snake Creek from Midway Charleston Road to Midway Hatchery.

WEBER COUNTY: Pine View Reservoir including all waters downstream from hard surface highway surrounding reservoir to dam, with the exception of the South Fork proper which is closed upstream to diversion of the Huntsville Canal.

C. WATERS WITH SPECIAL REGULATIONS

BEAVER COUNTY: Minersville Reservoir open to angling June 4 through December 31, 1960.

DUCHESNE COUNTY: Strawberry River from its confluence with Avintaquin Creek upstream to Sulphur Springs at Pole Gate as posted shall be open to angling June 4 through August 5, 1960, West Fork drainage of Duchesne River shall be open to angling July 1 through August 5, 1960.

D. WATERS OPEN TO YEAR-ROUND ANGLING

The following waters are open to twenty-four-hour a day year-round angling:

BEAVER COUNTY: Minersville Creek (Beaver Creek) downstream from Minersville Reservoir Dam.

BOX ELDER COUNTY: Bear River, Howell Reservoir, Locomotive Springs, Molad River, and Salt Creek.

CACHE COUNTY: Bear River and outlet canals in Utah below the Idaho State line, all waters in Cache County west of Highway 91 (except Wellsville Reservoir), and all waters between Highway 91 and State Highway 101.

BALLARD SPRINGS, and Cutler Reservoir.

CARBON COUNTY: Price River downstream from Highway 50 bridge at Colton.

DAGGETT COUNTY: Green River.

DAVIS COUNTY: All waters within Davis County except Holmes Creek Reservoir.

DUCHESNE COUNTY: Borham Lake, Duchesne River below confluence with Strawberry River, and Strawberry River below confluence with Red Creek.

EMERY COUNTY: Green River, Price River, and San Raphael River and tributaries downstream from Manti Forest boundary.

GARFIELD COUNTY: Colorado River, Pine Lake, Fremont River, and Sevier River (entire West Fork including Asay Creek).

GRAND COUNTY: Colorado River, Delores River from confluence with Colorado River upstream to Utah-Colorado State Line, and Green River.

JUAB COUNTY: Mono Reservoir, Sevier River proper, and Yuba Reservoir.

KANE COUNTY: Navajo Lake.

MILLARD COUNTY: Clear Lake, Garrison Reservoir (Preuss), Gunnison Bend Reservoir, and Sevier River proper.

PIUTE COUNTY: Otter Creek from Koosharem Reservoir downstream to and including Otter Creek Reservoir, Piute Reservoir, and Sevier River proper including East Fork below Otter Creek and entire West Fork.

RICH COUNTY: Bear Lake, and Bear River below Wyoming State line.

SALT LAKE COUNTY: All waters West of Highway 91.

SAN JUAN COUNTY: Colorado River and San Juan River.

SANPETE COUNTY: Gunnison Reservoir, Manti Creek, Nine-Mile Reservoir, Sanpitch River proper, Sevier River proper, Wales Reservoir, Yarns Reservoir, and Yuba Reservoir.

SEVIER COUNTY: Cave River, Redmond Lake, Sevier River proper, Venice Canal, Otter Creek from Koosharem Reservoir downstream to and including Otter Creek Reservoir.

TOOELE COUNTY: All waters within

may include but not exceed the following:
a. TROUT, SALMON in the aggregate—Ten (10) fish or seven (7) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.
b. GRAYLING in the aggregate—Ten (10) fish or seven (7) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.
c. BONNEVILLE CISCO: Twenty-five (25) fish.

d. BLACK BASS, WHITE BASS, AND PIKE in the aggregate—Ten (10) fish or fifteen (15) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.

e. WHITEFISH OR CATFISH: Twenty (20) fish or twenty (20) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first.

f. All other fish species not mentioned above, no bag, size or possession limit.

g. THE DAILY BAG and possession limit for resident children under twelve (12) years of age shall be four (4) game fish or three (3) pounds and one (1) fish, whichever is caught first. Fish taken by a non-resident under twelve (12) years of age are included in the limits of the licensed angler who must accompany the non-resident juvenile.

h. WEIGHTS shall be computed on dressed fish with heads and tails intact.

4. SIZE LIMITS: No size limit on game fish or non-game fish species.

5. METHODS OF ANGLING:

a. It shall be unlawful to take or attempt to take fish by any means other than angling. Angling shall mean fishing with a single line attached to a rod or pole, or trolling board held in the hands or attended and having attached thereto baits or lures permitted in this section unless otherwise specified as follows: "Attended" shall mean the angler shall be within 10 feet of equipment being used at all times.

b. BAITS: Angling is permitted with any bait except game fish or parts thereof and live fish. The eggs of all fish species are permitted for bait.

c. LURES: Angling is permitted with any mechanical lure, except no lure shall have more than four gangs of hooks, and no line shall have attached thereto more than two baited hooks or two artificial flies. Multiple prongs attached to a single shaft is defined as one hook.

d. CHUMMING: It shall be unlawful to cast, deposit, or cause to be cast or deposited in any waters of this State any device, material, or substance for the purpose of chumming or baiting the waters so as to cause or induce fish to gather.

e. ARTIFICIAL LIGHT: Angling by or with the aid of artificial light shall be prohibited. Camp-fires are not considered artificial light.

f. NON-GAME FISH may be taken for personal, non-commercial use from waters open to angling by angling and/or any other method or means except gill nets, trammel nets, trawl nets, hoop

nets, or any other device which crosses the north boundary of the Hole Stream Generating Plant properties being the south boundary of Utah Highway No. 52, to a point 350 yards distance along the canal course.

CACHE COUNTY: Bear River downstream from the Idaho State line, Little Bear River downstream from Highway 69, Cutler Reservoir, Hyrum Reservoir, Newton Reservoir, and Pelican Ponds.

CARBON COUNTY: Scofield Reservoir.

DAGGETT COUNTY: Green River and Spirit Lake.

DUCHESNE COUNTY: Barhom Lake, Mirror Lake, Moon Lake, and Scout Lake.

EMERY COUNTY: Cleveland Reservoir and Miller Flats Reservoir.

GARFIELD COUNTY: Lower Bowns Reservoir, Colorado River, North Creek Reservoir, Panguitch Lake, Pine Lake, Posey Lake, Tropic Reservoir, and Wide Hollow Reservoir.

GRAND COUNTY: Colorado River and Green River.

IRON COUNTY: New Castle Reservoir, Paragonah (Red Creek) Reservoir, and Yankee Meadow Reservoir.

JUAB COUNTY: Mona Reservoir and Yuba Reservoir.

MILLARD COUNTY: Diversion Dam north of Delta on Sevier River and Gunnison Bend Reservoir.

MORGAN COUNTY: East Canyon Reservoir.

PIUTE COUNTY: Otter Creek Reservoir and Piute Reservoir.

RICH COUNTY: Bear Lake.

SALT LAKE COUNTY: Jordan River.

SAN JUAN COUNTY: San Juan River and Colorado River.

SANPETE COUNTY: Fairview Lakes, Ferron Reservoir, Gooseberry Reservoir, Gunnison Reservoir, Huntington Reservoir, Miller Flats Reservoir, Nine-Mile Reservoir, Wales Reservoir, and Yuba Reservoir.

SEVIER COUNTY: Fish Lake, Forsythe Reservoir, Johnson Reservoir, Kaashoram Reservoir and Rex Reservoir.

SUMMIT COUNTY: Echo Reservoir, Hoops Lake, Smith and Morehouse Reservoir, Trial Lake, and Rockport Lake.

UINTAH COUNTY: Green River, Montez Creek Reservoir, Oakes Park Reservoir, and Paradise Park Reservoir.

UTAH COUNTY: Jordan River and Utah Lake.

WASATCH COUNTY: Deer Creek Reservoir and Strawberry Reservoir.

WASHINGTON COUNTY: Bakers Reservoir, Enterprise Reservoirs, Kolob Reservoir, Upper and Lower Sand Cove Reservoirs.

WAYNE COUNTY: Colorado River, Mill Meadow Reservoir, and Green River.

6. SPECIAL CLOSURES: As a conservation measure, any water or area may be closed to angling by properly posting with suitable signs and markers without further notice.

7. CHECKING STATIONS: If necessary, checking stations will be

UINTAH COUNTY: East Park Reservoir.

WASATCH COUNTY: Deer Creek from Highway No. 189 upstream to rail road crossing above Government property; Provo River immediately below Deer Creek Reservoir Dam and Deer Creek Reservoir in front of dam as marked and posted by Provo River Water Users markers; Midway Hatchery stream from hatchery property downstream to railroad bridge crossing, Snake Creek from Midway Charleston Road to Midway Hatchery.

WEBER COUNTY: Pine View Reservoir including all waters downstream from hard surface highway surrounding reservoir to dam, with the exception of the South Fork proper which is closed upstream to diversion of the Huntsville Canal.

C. WATERS WITH SPECIAL REGULATIONS

BEAVER COUNTY: Minersville Reservoir open to angling June 4 through December 31, 1960.

DUCHESNE COUNTY: Strawberry River from its confluence with Avintoquin Creek upstream to Sulphur Springs at Pole Gate as posted shall be open to angling June 4 through August 5, 1960, West Fork drainage of Duchesne River shall be open to angling July 4 through November 30, 1960, and Red Creek drainage, excluding Red Creek Reservoir, from Highway 40 upstream open to angling July 4 through November 30, 1960.

EMERY COUNTY: Cleveland Reservoir shall be open to angling July 4 through November 30, 1960.

MORGAN COUNTY: Francis Canyon stream above Francis Gate open to angling August 1 through November 30, 1960.

RICH COUNTY: Big Creek drainage open to angling July 4 through November 30, 1960.

SEVIER COUNTY: Kaashoram Reservoir open to angling June 4 through December 31, 1960.

WASATCH COUNTY: Currant Creek drainage from Highway No. 40 to source, Red Creek drainage, Lake Creek drainage from second crossing above old rock quarry open to angling July 4 through November 30, 1960, Witts Lake open to angling July 4 through September 8, 1960, and all tributaries to Strawberry Reservoir open to angling from July 4 through September 1, 1960.

SPECIAL WHITEFISH SEASON: The following waters are open to the taking of Rocky Mountain Whitefish: Logan River proper downstream from Temple

tributaries downstream from Mantle Forest boundary.

GARFIELD COUNTY: Colorado River, Pine Lake, Fremont River, and Sevier River (entire West Fork including Asay Creek).

GRAND COUNTY: Colorado River, Dolores River from confluence with Colorado River upstream to Utah-Colorado State Line, and Green River.

JUAB COUNTY: Mona Reservoir, Sevier River proper, and Yuba Reservoir.

KANE COUNTY: Navajo Lake.

MILLARD COUNTY: Clear Lake, Garrison Reservoir (Preuss), Gunnison Bend Reservoir, and Sevier River proper.

PIUTE COUNTY: Otter Creek from Kaashoram Reservoir downstream to and including Otter Creek Reservoir, Piute Reservoir, and Sevier River proper including East Fork below Otter Creek and entire West Fork.

RICH COUNTY: Bear Lake, and Bear River below Wyoming State line.

SALT LAKE COUNTY: All waters West of Highway 91.

SAN JUAN COUNTY: Colorado River and San Juan River.

SANPETE COUNTY: Gunnison reservoir, Mantle Creek, Nine-Mile Reservoir, Sanpitch River proper, Sevier River proper, Wales Reservoir, Yarns Reservoir, and Yuba Reservoir.

SEVIER COUNTY: Cove River, Redmond Lake, Sevier River proper, Venice Canal, Otter Creek from Kaashoram Reservoir downstream to and including Otter Creek Reservoir.

TOOELE COUNTY: All waters within Tooele County.

UINTAH COUNTY: Ashley Creek below Vernal-Mantle Highway, Big Brush Creek upstream to Big Spring in Brush Creek Gorge, Green River, Moritz Reservoir, and White River.

UTAH COUNTY: All waters west of Highway 91.

WASHINGTON COUNTY: Sand Cove Reservoir, and Virgin River proper below Narrows in Zion National Park.

WAYNE COUNTY: Fremont River proper from Garfield County line upstream to Mill Meadow Reservoir, and Green River.

WEBER COUNTY: The Ogden River and outlet canals downstream from Pine View Reservoir, and Weber River and outlet canals.

E. POSSESSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF FISH

1. SHIPPING: It shall be unlawful for any person to ship or cause to be shipped or transported out of this State any game fish taken from the waters of Utah hereby declared open to angling. However, a legal limit of game fish may accompany a bona fide angling license holder as he leaves the State.

2. POSSESSION: Possession of live tropical and goldfish species will be

Fish species are permitted for bait.

C. LURES: Angling is permitted with any mechanical lure, except no lure shall have more than four gangs of hooks, and no line shall have attached thereto more than two baited hooks or two artificial flies. Multiple prongs attached to a single shaft is defined as one hook.

d. CHUMMING: It shall be unlawful to cast, deposit, or cause to be cast or deposited in any waters of this State any device, material, or substance for the purpose of chumming or baiting the waters so as to cause or induce fish to gather.

e. ARTIFICIAL LIGHT: Angling by or with the aid of artificial light shall be prohibited. Camp-fires are not considered artificial light.

f. NON-GAME FISH may be taken for personal, non-commercial use from waters open to angling by angling and/or any other method or means except gill nets, trammel nets, trawl nets, hoop nets, fyke nets, electrical devices, chemicals, explosives or firearms.

g. SET LINES may be used day or night in the Bear River proper and outlet canals downstream from the Idaho line, the Little Bear River proper and outlet canals below Highway 69, Colorado River, Green River, Malad River, Jordan River and outlet canals, San Juan River and Utah Lake. Set lines may have any number of hooks except in Utah Lake where only one line with a maximum of ten (10) hooks is permitted. Set lines need not be attended but must be securely anchored at one end to a non-moving object.

h. USE OF DIP NETS: A legal limit of Bonneville Cisco may be taken from Bear Lake during the period from January 1 through February 15, 1960 using a dip net which shall have an opening not greater than 18 inches in any dimension and the mesh size shall not exceed 1/2 inch bar mesh.

i. USE OF BOATS: Angling from boats, rafts or other floating devices without motors is permitted on all lakes and impoundments of the State except as specified below (angling from boats, rafts, or other floating devices on streams is permitted only on streams specifically specified in the proclamation):

i. ANGLING FROM: Boats, rafts or other floating devices (with or without

Kaasharem Reservoir and Rex Reservoir.
SUMMIT COUNTY: Echo Reservoir, Hoops Lake, Smith and Morehouse Reservoir, Trial Lake, and Rockport Lake.

UINTAH COUNTY: Green River, Montez Creek Reservoir, Oakes Park Reservoir, and Paradise Park Reservoir.
UTAH COUNTY: Jordan River and Utah Lake.

WASATCH COUNTY: Deer Creek Reservoir and Strawberry Reservoir.
WASHINGTON COUNTY: Bakers Reservoir, Enterprise Reservoirs, Kolob Reservoir, Upper and Lower Sand Cove Reservoirs.

WAYNE COUNTY: Colorado River, Mill Meadow Reservoir, and Green River.

6. SPECIAL CLOSURES: As a conservation measure, any water or area may be closed to angling by properly posting with suitable signs and markers without further notice.

7. CHECKING STATIONS: If necessary checking stations will be established any place by the Utah Fish and Game Department. It shall be unlawful for any person to fail to stop at checking stations or road blocks where a stop sign and/or red light is displayed.

B. CLOSED WATERS

The following marked and posted waters are hereby closed to angling:

STATE PROPERTY: All waters within or adjacent to all properties owned or operated by the Utah Department of Fish and Game for propagation, spawning, or fish rearing purposes. Waterfowl nesting grounds or State waterfowl refuges as posted by refuge managers.

BEAVER COUNTY: Beaver Creek from its entry into Minersville Reservoir (as posted) upstream to Highway 91.

DAGGETT COUNTY: Sheep Creek Lake and Browne Lake.

DAVIS COUNTY: Holmes Creek Reservoir.

DUCHESNE COUNTY: Red Creek Reservoir.

GARFIELD COUNTY: Tropic Reservoir and its entire contributing drainage.

IRON COUNTY: Hendrickson Lake.

MORGAN COUNTY: Hard Scrabble Creek—All tributaries closed. Hard Scrabble Creek proper

through November 30, 1960.
MORGAN COUNTY: Francis Canyon stream above Francis Gate open to angling August 1 through November 30, 1960.

RICH COUNTY: Big Creek drainage open to angling July 4 through November 30, 1960.

SEVIER COUNTY: Koosharem Reservoir open to angling June 4 through December 31, 1960.

WASATCH COUNTY: Currant Creek drainage from Highway No. 40 to source, Red Creek drainage, Lake Creek drainage from second crossing above old rock quarry open to angling July 4 through November 30, 1960, Witts Lake open to angling July 4 through September 8, 1960, and all tributaries to Strawberry Reservoir open to angling from July 4 through September 1, 1960.

SPECIAL WHITEFISH SEASON: The following waters are open to the taking of Rocky Mountain Whitefish: Logan River proper downstream from Temple Fork of Logan River in Cache County, Blacksmith Fork River proper downstream from the Anderson Ranch Bridge in Cache County, Duchesne River proper downstream from the confluence of North Fork and West Fork of the Duchesne River in Duchesne County, shall be open to angling from January 1 through February 15, 1960 and from June 4 through December 31, 1960, Weber River proper in Davis, Weber, Morgan and that portion of Summit County upstream to Echo Dam shall be open to angling from June 4 through December 31, 1960.

JUVENILE STREAMS: The following streams are set aside for juvenile fishing for children under fourteen (14) years of age. Creel and possession limits on these streams shall be four (4) game fish or three (3) pounds whichever is taken first; Pine Valley stream in Washington County from the east end of Pine Valley Reservoir to the east end of Pine Valley park as posted.

Smoky Springs pond in Duchesne County at the end of the Uintah River road near the U-Bar Ranch as posted.

Spring Creek through Marion Green property near American Fork as marked and posted.

WASHINGTON COUNTY: Sand Cove Reservoir, and Virgin River proper below Narrows in Zion National Park.
WAYNE COUNTY: Fremont River proper from Garfield County line upstream to Mill Meadow Reservoir, and Green River.

WEBER COUNTY: The Ogden River and outlet canals downstream from Pine View Reservoir, and Weber River and outlet canals.

E. POSSESSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF FISH

1. SHIPPING: It shall be unlawful for any person to ship or cause to be shipped or transported out of this State any game fish taken from the waters of Utah hereby declared open to angling. However, a legal limit of game fish may accompany a bona fide angling license holder as he leaves the State.

2. POSSESSION: Possession of live tropical and goldfish species will be permitted for exhibition and commercial purposes. These exotic fish species may be transported.

3. TRANSPORTING LIVE FISH: No person except licensed hatchery and/or private pond operators or licensed seiners engaged in the business of transporting live game fish or live bait fish in and out of the State of Utah may, at any time, hold or have in his possession any species of live fish, except as specified in Item E-2 of the proclamation or with special permission from the Fish and Game Department.

4. STOCKING: No person, partnership, company, corporation, or Governmental agency may place into any of the waters of the State of Utah any species of fish without first obtaining permission from the Utah State Department of Fish and Game.

Violation of any of the regulations of this proclamation shall be termed a misdemeanor and this proclamation shall have full force and effect of the law.

Amendment #1 to the 1960 Angling Proclamation

An amenduement to the 1960 Angling Proclamation as advertised December 27, 1959, in the Salt Lake Tribune, a daily newspaper published in Salt Lake City, Utah.

WHEREAS, The Fish and Game Commission of the State of Utah has deemed it advisable to make certain changes in the regulations as advertised in the 1960 Angling Proclamation and does hereby declare and proclaim under authority of Title 23, Session Laws of 1953, that these regulations shall be altered as follows and become effective May 31, 1960.

1. East Canyon Creek from its entrance in to East Canyon Reservoir upstream to Peterson Draw near Gorgorza, as posted shall be open to angling July 4, 1960 through November 30, 1960.

2. Browne Lake, located in Daggett County, shall be open to angling on June 4, 1960 and remain open until closed at the discretion of the Fish and Game Department. Angling from boats or other floating devices is prohibited on the above water.

This smendment shall alter only those provisions in the proclamation as stated above; all other provisions of the 1960 Angling Proclamation shall remain in full force and effect.
